Included as part of the new fully accessible website will be information relating to palliative care, pregnancy and baby loss, resources for children and young people, information for people who have been bereaved by suicide and those who have suffered a sudden or traumatic loss, as well as practical support including financial and legal advice.

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JOUNRAL ARTICLE- Frailty on the island of Ireland: evidence from the NICOLA and TILDA

Background: Aimed to compare the prevalence, characteristics and associated mortality risk of Frailty in Northern Ireland (NI) and the Republic of Ireland (ROI).

Key Points:

- Frailty is a major public health concern for both Ireland and Northern Ireland.
- However, the prevalence is twice as high in Northern Ireland which has a major impact on health and social care provision.
- This is an important factor for all island public health policy and awareness.
- The causes of these differences are unknown.
